Notice of Annual General Meeting

I am pleased to be writing to you with details of our Annual General Meeting ('**AGM**') to be held on Thursday 17 December 2020 at 12 noon. Typically, I would be pleased to invite you to attend the AGM in person, however, due to the outbreak of the Coronavirus ('**COVID-19**') it has been necessary to make changes on how we hold and conduct this year's AGM.

Following changes to company law introduced under the Corporate Insolvency and Governance Act 2020 on 26 June 2020, and as a result of the UK Government 'stay alert measures' and related guidance on social distancing and public gatherings ('COVID-19 Related Measures'), the board of directors (the 'Board') has decided that the AGM will be held on a closed basis. This decision has been taken to protect the health and safety of our colleagues and shareholders in light of the COVID 19 Related Measures currently in place and recognising the possibility of increased measures being introduced nearer to the date of the AGM. The AGM will be held as a closed meeting that is solely functional in format and shareholders will not be able to attend. A very limited number of persons from the Company will conduct the meeting such that relevant legal requirements can be satisfied. As shareholders will not be able to attend in person, we strongly encourage voting on all resolutions by completing a proxy appointment form appointing the chairman of the meeting as your proxy. All valid proxy votes to be exercised by the chairman of the meeting will also be included in any vote taken at the meeting. The appointment of any person other than the chairman of the meeting would result in your votes not being cast, as third party proxies will not be permitted to attend the AGM.

Despite these exceptional circumstances, the Board is keen to maintain engagement with shareholders. In order to facilitate this, if you are a shareholder and would like to ask the Board a question on the formal business of the AGM, please email your question to info@focusriteplc.com by 12 noon on Tuesday 15 December 2020. Answers to any frequently asked questions may be published on our website at www.focusriteplc.com following the AGM.

The formal notice of AGM is set out on pages 5 to 6 of this document. If you would like to vote on the resolutions proposed at the AGM (the 'Resolutions') despite not being attending the AGM in person, please fill in the Form of Proxy sent to you with this document and return it, in accordance with the instructions given, to our registrars as soon as possible. They must receive it by 12 noon on Tuesday 15 December 2020. This letter is intended to help you understand the effect and purpose of the Resolutions.

Each of the Resolutions to be considered at the AGM will be voted on by way of a poll. This ensures that shareholders who are not able to attend the AGM, but who have appointed proxies, have their votes fully taken into account. The results of the polls will be announced to the London Stock Exchange and published on the Company's website as soon as possible after the conclusion of the AGM.

Resolution 1: Reports and Accounts

The directors of the Company (the '**Directors**') are required to present to shareholders, at the AGM, the financial statements for the year ended 31 August 2020, together with the reports of the Directors (including the strategic report) and auditors thereon (the 'Annual Report').

Resolution 2: Declaration of the final dividend

The Directors are recommending, and the shareholders are being asked to approve, the declaration of a final dividend of 2.9 pence per ordinary share for the year ended 31 August 2020. The final dividend will, subject to shareholder approval, be paid on 29 January 2021 to the holders of ordinary shares whose names are recorded on the Register of Members of the Company at the close of business on 8 January 2021.

Resolutions 3 to 8: Election and re-election of Directors

As was the case at the AGM on 20 December 2019, all the Directors will seek re-election.

In relation to the retirement and re-election of Directors at its AGM, and whilst it is not subject to the provisions of the UK Corporate Governance Code (the 'Code'), the Board has determined that in line with the best practice recommendations of the Code, each of the Directors shall retire from office at the AGM. Each of the Directors intends to stand for re-election by the shareholders. Resolutions 3 to 8 relate to the re-election of the Directors.

The biographical details of the Directors are set out on pages 42 to 43 of the Annual Report.



Resolution 9: The auditors

Company law requires the Company, at each general meeting at which accounts are laid, to appoint auditors to serve for the following financial year. Resolution 9 proposes to reappoint KPMG LLP as auditors of the Company and authorises the Directors to agree to the auditors' remuneration.

Resolution 10: Authority to allot shares pursuant to section 551 of the Companies Act 2006 (the 'Act')

The Directors may only allot shares and grant rights to subscribe for, or convert any security into, shares if authorised to do so by shareholders. Resolution 10 will be proposed as an Ordinary Resolution to grant new authorities to allot shares and grant rights to subscribe for, or convert any security into, shares up to an aggregate nominal amount of £19,370.55 (representing approximately 33.3% of the nominal value of the issued ordinary share capital of the Company as at 19 November 2020, being the last practicable business day prior to publication of this notice).

Resolutions 11 and 12: Authority to disapply pre-emption rights pursuant to section 570 of the Act (Special Resolutions)

The Directors also require authority from shareholders to allot equity securities for cash otherwise than to existing shareholders pro rata to their holdings. Resolutions 11 and 12 will be proposed as Special Resolutions to grant such authority.

Resolution 11 renews the Directors' power to allot equity securities in exchange for cash without first offering them to existing shareholders. Apart from rights issues or any other pre-emptive offer concerning equity securities, the authority contained in this Resolution will be limited to the issue of shares for cash up to an aggregate nominal value of £2,905.58. This number represents approximately 5% of the Company's issued share capital as at 19 November 2020, being the last practicable date prior to publication of this notice.

Resolution 11 also seeks a disapplication of pre-emption rights on a rights issue, so as to allow the Directors to make appropriate arrangements in relation to fractional entitlements or other legal or practical problems which might arise.

On 12 March 2015, the Pre-Emption Group ('**PEG**') issued a revised Statement of Principles ('**2015 Statement of Principles**'). This stated that, in addition to previous standard annual disapplication of pre-emption rights up to a maximum equal to 5% of issued ordinary share capital, the PEG was also supportive of extending the general disapplication authority by an additional 5% for certain purposes.

On 5 May 2016, the PEG published a monitoring report on the implementation of its 2015 Statement of Principles for disapplying pre-emption rights and a recommended template Resolution for disapplying pre-emption rights. The template recommends companies request authority to disapply pre-emption rights in respect of the additional 5% to be used when the Board considers the use to be for an acquisition or specified capital investment in accordance with the 2015 Statement of Principles as a separate Resolution to the disapplication to issue share on an unrestricted basis.

Resolution 12 seeks this separate and additional authority. The Directors confirm, in accordance with the 2015 Statement of Principles, that they will only allot shares representing no more than an additional 5% of the issued ordinary share capital of the Company for cash pursuant to the authority referred to in Resolution 12, where the allotment is in connection with an acquisition or specified capital investment, which is announced contemporaneously with the allotment. Where the authority granted under Resolution 12 is used, the circumstances that have led to its use and the consultation process undertaken will be disclosed by the Company in its next Annual Report.

The Board also intends to adhere to the provisions in the PEG's 2015 Statement of Principles and will not (except in relation to an issue pursuant to Resolution 12 in respect of the additional 5% referred to above) allot shares for cash on a non-pre-emptive basis pursuant to the authority in Resolution 11 in excess of an amount equal to 7.5% of the total issued ordinary share capital of the Company, excluding treasury shares, within a rolling three-year period, without prior consultation with the Company's shareholders.

The Directors have no present intention of issuing new shares other than pursuant to employee share plans, but the Directors consider that the authority sought is appropriate as it provides the Company with the necessary flexibility to take advantage of business opportunities as they arise.

Resolution 13: Purchases of own shares by the Company (Special Resolution)

Resolution 13 seeks authority from shareholders for the Company to make market purchases of its own ordinary shares, such authority being limited to the purchase of up to 5,811,164 ordinary shares (being approximately 10% of the Company's issued ordinary share capital as at 19 November 2020). The maximum and minimum prices payable are also limited in the Resolution. The authority will only be exercised if the Directors consider that there is likely to be a beneficial impact on earnings per ordinary share and that it is in the best interests of the Company at the time. The Company will be able to hold the ordinary shares which have been repurchased as treasury shares and re-sell them for cash, cancel them or use them for the purposes of its employee share schemes.

If given, the powers in Resolutions 10 to 13 inclusive will expire after 15 months or at the conclusion of the AGM to be held in 2021 whichever is the earlier. As at the date of this notice the Company holds no treasury shares.



Resolution 14: Adoption of new articles of association ('New Articles') (Special Resolution)

The Board is proposing to adopt New Articles. The New Articles contain amendments which are of a minor, technical or clarifying nature and also amend the existing articles for the following reasons:

To permit general meetings to be held partly by electronic means

The changes mean the Company may hold 'hybrid' general meetings (including AGMs) in such a way that enables members to attend and participate in the business of the meeting by attending a physical location or by attending by means of an electronic facility. Voting at hybrid meetings will, by default, be decided on a poll. The changes will not permit meetings to be held exclusively on an electronic basis, so a physical meeting will still be required. In deciding whether to hold a hybrid general meeting in future, the Company will have regard to the views of shareholders and institutional governance bodies at the relevant time. The proposed changes give additional powers in respect of postponing or adjourning meetings in appropriate circumstances.

The amendments are being sought in response to challenges posed by UK Government restrictions as a result of the COVID-19 pandemic, which have made it difficult for shareholders to attend physical general meetings. The Board's aim in introducing these changes is to make it easier for shareholders to participate in general meetings through introducing electronic access for those not able to travel or attend, and also to ensure that appropriate security measures are in place for the protection and wellbeing of shareholders.

Removal of borrowing limits

The existing articles contain a limit on the Company's borrowing powers so that, save with the prior approval of the Company's shareholders by ordinary resolution, borrowings may not exceed a sum equal to the greater of: (a) £15,000,000 or (b) two and a half times the aggregate of: (i) the earnings before interest tax, depreciation and amortisation of the Company, as calculated from the latest audited accounts of the Company; (ii) adding back any exceptional items that constitute losses; and (iii) deducting any exceptional items that constitute profits.

In late December 2019, shareholders voted in favour of an ordinary resolution to increase the borrowing limit in (a) above to £60,000,000 to enable the Group to fund future material acquisitions with debt.

The Directors are now proposing to remove the borrowing limits in the New Articles entirely in order to provide flexibility for the future funding requirements of the Company.

Change of name

Although there is no current intention to change the Company's name, the New Articles, as permitted by the Act, contain a provision enabling the Directors to change the name of the Company.

The proposed New Articles are available to view on the Company's website, www.focusriteplc.com and will be available until the conclusion of the AGM.

Recommendation

The Directors consider the Resolutions to be in the best interests of the Company and its shareholders. Accordingly, the Directors unanimously recommend shareholders to vote in favour of all the Resolutions.
